Savings Incentive Program – A Bonus for Their Efforts

STEHM has recently introduced a new Savings Incentive Program for our Martha House residents. Residents "in good standing" are now eligible to receive monetary incentives for successfully reaching 30-day (\$50), 180-day (\$75) and 270-day (\$100) milestones. Upon reaching each milestone, the corresponding incentive will be deposited into the resident's savings account and added to their own required savings, which are fully refunded to them when they leave the program. In order to be considered "in good standing," residents must be in compliance with

all program rules and expectations, participating in all required activities and case management sessions, and demonstrating consistent effort toward achieving their established personal goals.

This initiative is designed to promote growth, accountability and progress during residents' time in the program. We hope these small bonuses, acknowledging success along the way, will further encourage and support residents' efforts toward their ultimate goal of independence and financial self-sufficiency.

The Right Program for the Right Candidate

Arianna was a resident of Martha House for nine months, having come to us through one of our partnering agencies. At the time, she was homeless and seeking assistance. Her goal was to find stable housing and a job, which made her a great candidate for the Martha House program.

During her stay at Martha House, Arianna engaged in the Financial Independence Program, working with a Certified Financial Planner through our collaboration with West End Neighborhood House. She worked diligently to pay off some previous

debts, increase her credit score and save money. During her first few months with us, Arianna struggled to keep a consistent job, as well as with the loss of her mother. Through these trials and tribulations, however, she continued to stay focused and was ultimately able to land a full-time job as an Activities Coordinator at a senior living facility. In this position, Arianna grew to love her responsibilities and enjoyed engaging with the patients. She also proved herself to be goaloriented and productive.

After eight months with us, Arianna began looking for her own apartment. She went to see various

apartments, searching to find a place on the route to her job, to ensure she could get to work. Arianna applied and was accepted for an apartment close to a bus route and in a convenient area. STEHM assisted her with the security deposit from the GRIP funds, as well as a number of household goods. Arianna said that she was "happy to be a part of the program" and that it had helped her tremendously in the transition from homelessness to independent living. She extends her gratitude for the opportunities the Martha House program gave her.

And that is what Martha House is all about – opportunity.
