

Creating Partnerships between Emergency Housing Non-Profits, Schools, and CoCs under EHCY

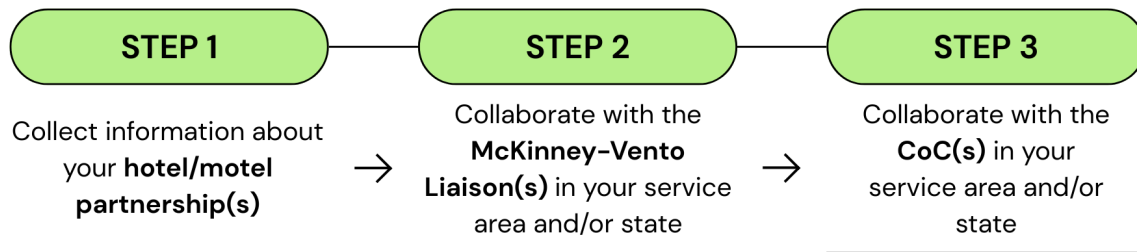

Dear Fellow Emergency Housing Non-Profit Board Members and Staff,

On August 4, 2026, the United States Department of Education released a [Dear Colleague Letter](#) stating that Education for Homeless Children and Youth (EHCY) grant funds could be used, subject to certain provisions, to provide emergency housing for students and families experiencing homelessness. To create partnerships with the schools and Continuum of Care(s) (CoCs) in your service area or state, please see the following recommendations. HOW CAN NON-PROFITS RESPOND TO THE CHANGES IN EHCY?



Step 1. Reach out to your non-profit's point of contact for the following details regarding your hotel/motel partnership(s):

- Cost of stay per night or week
- Any stipulations and/or regulations on duration of stay
- Any stipulations and/or regulations on who can stay
- Who to contact and how
- Any other relevant information (e.g., referral requirements)

Step 1a. Collaborate to draft a [Memorandum of Understanding](#) (MOU).

Step 2. Reach out to the [McKinney-Vento Liaison\(s\)](#) for your service area and/or state:

 Who are McKinney-Vento Liaisons?

McKinney-Vento Liaisons at the school, district, regional, and/or state levels support the identification of students experiencing homelessness and the provision of services as required by the [McKinney-Vento Act](#) (e.g., transportation, school stability, immediate enrollment, coordination of services).
